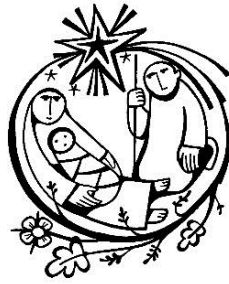


From the Pastor's Desk:

It is official! MERRY CHRISTMAS! While the culture tries to tell us that season of Christmas is past, the Church tells us that the great season of Christmas has begun. Right now, we, as a Universal Church, are in the midst of the "Octave of Christmas". We celebrate spiritually, with a greater intensity this great feast. Some of the things that we do different liturgically is to say the Creed and even the Gloria during the weekday Masses. (Recall, that during the Advent season, the Gloria is omitted and falls silent.)



You have heard it said that "Time flies when you are having fun!" It must be for me personally "beyond fun" to being "FANTASTIC", as the weeks of Advent, these first days of Christmas and really these past six months (as of this coming Tuesday, December 30th) have been like being in a rocket ship, travelling at the speed of light.

This weekend, the Universal Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. Early on, in the first beginnings of this sacred union of St. Joseph, the Blessed Mother and the Christ Child, this Holy Family was on the move. Mary and Joseph were on the move to register when Mary was heavy with child. Mary and Joseph were on the move when the Holy Family fled into Egypt to escape the corrupt leaders know as Herod. And in today's gospel from St. Luke, the family is also on the move, as they have come with the new-born Christ Child to have him circumcised in the great temple and city of Jerusalem.

Simeon greets the Holy Family as a very old man. One could say that Simeon's life is past; yet with Advent and Christmas "HOPE", he continues to look among the people moving in and out of that great wonder of the ancient world, the Jewish temple, if he might catch a glimpse of the future Messiah. Simeon sees something in that newborn that even Mary and Joseph have yet to see, as St. Luke writes: "*The child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him...*".

Then Simeon is moved to prayer, asking that God would let him "move on" to the next world, as he had experienced the fullness of life here on earth by encountering the Messiah.

During the Christmas season, there is a lot of movement of people. People are driving or flying to and from family and friends. There is movement to the malls to buy things...and then to return them. Of course there is movement to the Church, as a large portion of the Christian faithful still believe it is not Christmas unless they attend a service or a Mass.

Yet, while Christmas is about so much "physical" movement, it is much more about a "spiritual" movement. Moving from sinfulness to sainthood, from the culture to entering Christ in a more profound spiritual way.

May this Christmas be as memorable for you and your family as it was for Simeon who encountered the Holy Family and the Christ Child that first Christmas season. May your hearts "move" closer to Christ through this intense sacramental and spiritual time. Merry Christmas!

helping with community service projects. A retreat is being planned in February with the youth of the parish. 30 kids are showing up on Wednesday evenings for gym/open time. Majority of students involved in the youth program are junior high age. Worship Committee: All Souls’ Day Mass at 10:00 A.M. on Sunday resulted in a capacity crowd with the choir loft filled. Worship is planning to do this Mass on Sunday annually closest to All Souls’ Day. Harvest decorations were well received. Much work is being done to create a new and expanded environment for Christmas this year.

Father reported that the D.M.A. is at 52% of the goal. Father is hearing favorable comments regarding the liturgy and Mass attendance. The Mankato area priests have returned to the tradition of meeting regularly to discuss parish life. Discussions will involve how our parish can work more closely together in the years ahead rather than doing everything independently. (No decisions or plans are in place at this time.)

The Pastoral Council continued to discuss the pastoral concerns of the parish. The area focused in at this time involved the “Parish Structures”. Church – Strengths: Beautiful space, adequate size, nice sanctuary, pretty-well maintained, newer windows and stained glass, newer boiler, lighting improved in social hall, roof 09, church is air conditioned. Church – Weaknesses: Length of the church, can’t see in the cry room, no gathering/narthex area, no visitation area for funerals, slow elevator, too many steps into church, flooring under the pews is original and worn, air conditioning improper functioning, need to paint, improve sanctuary lighting, kitchen outdated, ceiling in social hall updating needed, greater security for the church, bridal room – needs updating, need new church sign. Men’s bathroom update ventilation. School Building – Strengths: large space, available for rental for community, sufficient space for religious education, witness to Catholic education. School – Weaknesses: High maintenance/heating costs, need for more nursery space, much asbestos in pipes and ceilings, under-utilized space, largely sits empty most of the time, insufficient rent payments for the cost to maintain, boiler system is original, windows are original, built as an elementary school, not handicapped accessible, roof repairs due to flat roof construction.

The meeting adjourned. *The next scheduled meeting is being set for Monday, January 26th at 6:30 P.M.* Future Business: continued pastoral planning/discussion.

The Holy Rosary Pastoral Council convened in the Conference Room, beginning with prayer. Nearly all of the members were in attendance. C.C.W. is working on the annual Christmas bake sale, joint Christmas Party along with the K. of C., among other projects. Religious Ed. classes are already on their ninth class for the year. A living rosary was said, safe environment has been implemented, First Reconciliation is being finalized and children are being picked up in the gym this year, that has worked well. The theme of religious education is “Compassion Just Like Jesus”. Confirmation has been set by the Diocese for February 28th, with 21 students to be confirmed. A \$500.00 grant was given to the religious ed. program through Catholic Aid. (Father is visiting/teaching all of the classrooms this year.) Youth Group: 16 students have been

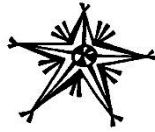

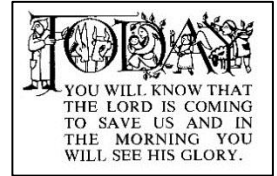
New Year's – Solemnity, Mary, the Mother of God
