



From the Pastor's Desk

“And just as Moses lifted up the serpent, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.”

-St. John

This weekend we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Of all of the relics of the Church, perhaps the most revered is of course the remnants of wood of the “True Cross”. I have had the privilege of seeing a relic of the true cross many times in the sacristy while attending seminary. It was a great meditation to think that this small splinter of wood would have had a share in the great moment of redemption on that “first” Good Friday. Likewise, what a meditation the Holy Eucharist is too, for we come to Mass to receive in our hand and on our lips the very one who we claim to be the Son of God, the Savior of the world!

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is a special feast for me personally. Having spent time at the seminary that was run by the Crosier Fathers and Brothers, this feast was for the Crosier Order, their primary feast day. Regardless of what day it was, the Feast of the Holy Cross was a free day for the students. We had a Mass with the choir singing (of which I was a member), a brunch, some fun sport activities in the afternoon and some type of pizza or ice-cream party in the evening.

But the day was not about “freedom”, it was about “faith”. If there was any prayer that we all learned from the Crosiers it was this: *“We adore you oh Christ and we praise you, because by your Holy and glorious Cross you have redeemed our world.”* (*If you attend the Stations of the Cross, these words might sound very familiar to you as well.) The Crosiers had on their habit, and over their heart, the Crosier cross that was a simple red and white cross on a black background. That cross was proclaiming to themselves and to the world that Christ’s cross is the most important symbol and sign of our salvation.

Today’s First Reading from the Book of Numbers as well as today’s Gospel account from St. John go together like the horizontal and vertical bars of the cross of Christ. For in the First Reading, the people have betrayed God and are brought back to healing when they look at the bronze serpent that is fashioned by Moses under the direction of Almighty God. Then, in today’s Gospel account, our Blessed Lord recalls this very passage of scripture from the Old Testament as He is speaking to His friend Nicodemus.

In a good way, the Blessed Lord tells Nicodemus that He is a “snake”. Now, normally, if someone tells you that “You are a snake!” this is not complimentary. But in keeping with the spirit of the cross and its contradiction, the words of Christ are very complimentary when it comes to Good News! *For the Lord is stating that just as Moses, the Father of the Israelite people, lifted up the serpent in the desert to heal the people physically; so too must God the Father, lift up the Savior in the desert of sin to heal the people spiritually.* What a beautiful analogy as how something so contradictory could be so complimentary and so Christ-like!

The Church has recently instructed the Universal Church that the Cross in the sanctuary and in the procession should not be of a risen Christ or a bare cross but of the ONE, who was crucified for the sake of us sinners. How blessed we are at Holy Rosary, that we have both of these beautiful crosses the procession and the sanctuary for our meditation and edification at the weekend Masses. May we take a moment this week to reflect and meditate on the “scandal” of the cross as well as its “sacredness”. Have a wonderful week! Thank you for coming to our liturgy!!!
