

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus said: "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." -St. John

Recently, one of our parish trustees suggested that it might be in good order to have a radon test done in the rectory. With a house that is 90 years old and having an old fashioned basement where radon gas can more easily enter, it seemed like a logical thing to do.



The test took several days to complete and, even though there were some mitigating factors that should have lowered the numbers such as open doors last Saturday (as we were taking out items for the parish auction), amazingly, the numbers were far higher than the normal level. Unfortunately, this means that a \$1,500.00 exhaust system needs to be installed in the coming weeks in the rectory basement. (I guess it is cheaper than developing lung cancer!?!)

In the lower caverns (dare I say, basement area of the Vatican) one of the oldest images of Christian art is the depiction of Christ as the "Good Shepherd". And, just as it is an act of faith to accept the test results of an odorless, tasteless and invisible gas like radon; so too, it is to believe in our Redeemer, as the Good Shepherd whom we cannot see or smell, however, we know He is present and watching over us...because we can taste the Good Shepherd through the Holy Eucharist!

This weekend we honor, at the 10:00 A.M. Mass, our 22 young people from Holy Rosary's religious education program and Catholic School who will be making their First Holy Communion. They will be able, for the first time, to "taste" the "goodness of the Lord" and the "Good Shepherd" through the Holy Eucharist.

This is not only a special time for our second graders, but it is also a special time for all of us as Roman Catholics. For when we participate in a First Holy Communion Mass, we are again reminded of our First Holy Communion and all of the excitement and enthusiasm that we brought to the altar of God for the very first time.

Secondly, witnessing these children and their parents as they come forward to receive the Redeemer has the same qualities as believing in "radon gas". We trust that the "professionals" who work in this industry will discover it and address the radon problem. Similarly, when anyone from a second-grader to a sixty-two-year-old comes forward to receive Christ in Holy Communion, we trust that, through the "exact" words of the "priest", the Spirit of Christ (almost like an invisible gas) might come upon the simple gifts of bread and wine and transform them and us who receive Holy Communion into the Good News of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

One of the my most treasured gifts I received on the occasion of my First Holy Communion back in the 1970's was a rosary that was given to me by my godmother from Sleepy Eye. Moving from school to school and eventually parish to parish, it somehow vanished, like an invisible gas into thin air.

Just a few years ago, my mother reminded me that I still had some things up in our farmhouse attic from my college days. Sure enough, in the bottom of a box of college papers and books was my coveted rosary from my First Holy Communion.

The rosary is now in a safe place in my bedroom. A lot of years have passed since I first received that rosary and I had my first thoughts that I wanted to be a priest. Today, as I stand before you as your pastor of "Holy Rosary" in North Mankato, I could never have imagined what God had in store for me so many years ago.

May our young people know that Jesus Christ, although not visible in human form, is visible as the Good Shepherd in the Eucharist under the forms of bread and wine at every Mass. May these young people come to know how the Good Shepherd is leading them all, personally, to a holy life, filled with many joys (and a few sorrows). But, with the strength of the sacraments and the strong arms of the Good Shepherd, may we be lead to those green pastures of hope and holiness and one day share with Christ everlasting life! It would be spiritually tragic if after making our First Holy Communion, we vanish, like an invisible radon gas, not to be seen again!

Congratulations First Communicants! May you come to know that the greatest gift your parents can give you is the greatest gift my parents gave to me and led me to the priesthood...coming to Mass each Sunday! God bless you all!

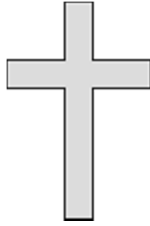
